General Meeting Information

The American Dairy Science Association® (ADSA®), American Society of Animal Science (ASAS), Canadian Society of Animal Science, Asociacion Mexicana de Produccion Animal (AMPA), and Western Section American Society of Animal Science will hold the 2012 Joint Annual Meeting (JAM) in Phoenix, Arizona, July 15–19. Location

The meeting will be held at the Phoenix Convention Center and area hotels. The convention center is ideally located in downtown Phoenix within walking distance of hotels, shopping, and dining.

Notice to Nonmember Presenters

If an abstract is accepted, a presenter must attend the meeting to present (this applies to both oral *and* poster presentations). If a nonmember presenter (i.e., not a member of ADSA or ASAS) is not registered for the 2012 Joint Annual Meeting by 11:59 pm (central time) on **April 2, 2012**, the abstract will not be published. It will be removed from the program and will no longer be available for presentation at the meeting. Nonmembers who register but cannot attend the meeting and are unable to arrange for a substitute presenter will receive a 90% refund, provided the reason for nonattendance is a personal emergency. If nonattendance is due to visa denial, a 50% refund shall be made. All nonmember presenter requests for refunds must be accompanied by appropriate documentation and will be processed after the meeting in the form in which registration payment was made (i.e., if you paid by credit card, the refund will be applied to your credit card account). If you cannot attend but do arrange for a co-author to make your oral presentation, please contact FASS headquarters (abstract@assoq.org) to provide your change of information.

Each poster presentation will be available for public viewing for the entire day, with the presenting authors present during the open posters time (7:30–9:30 am). All posters must be mounted on the board 30 minutes before the beginning of the day's session (**poster sessions begin at 7:30 am so posters must be mounted on boards by 7:00 am**) and must list the paper number and corresponding day. The exhibit hall will open at 6:30 am, Monday through Wednesday. **Posters must be removed after 5:00 pm each day.** Any posters remaining after 5:30 pm will be removed by the convention center staff and discarded.

Each poster board area is 48 inches high and 96 inches wide. Use of this space is dictated by the presenter, with the following exceptions: the top of the poster space must include the abstract number with corresponding letter of the day it is being presented, title, authors, and affiliations. The lettering for this section should be at least 1 inch high.

Transportation in Phoenix

The JAM hotels and the convention center are approximately five miles from Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport (PHX). The taxi ride will take approximately 15 minutes. The one-way fare for a taxi from the airport to the Phoenix Convention Center area will be approximately \$20.00. A shuttle service (Airport Shuttle) is also available; go online to book a shuttle in advance (<http://www.airportshuttle.com>). The standard rate is \$24.00 round-trip. A shuttle bus connects the airport to the the METRO Light Rail system, which runs to the downtown area.

While you're in Phoenix, you can get around with the METRO Light Rail, which runs from central Phoenix through downtown, Tempe and the ASU campus, to Mesa in the east. Stations are close to and run right by some of the area's top attractions, such as the Heard Museum, Phoenix Art Museum, the Arizona Science Center, Chase Field, US Airways Center, Sun Devil Stadium, and many more. A one-way pass costs \$1.75 and an all-day pass is \$3.50. Passes can be purchased at the ticket vending machines at each station. During the week, trains generally run every 12 minutes from 5 am to 11 pm. On weekends, they run about every 15 minutes from 5 am until 2 am. Genomic Selection in Livestock, July 9-13, Sheraton Phoenix. Course instructors: Dorian Garrick, Rohan Fernando, and Jack Dekkers (Iowa State University). The purpose of the course is to provide graduate students and professionals in animal breeding and genetics with the basic theory and practical application of using whole genome SNP data for genetic evaluation and genome-wide association studies, using mixed linear and Bayesian methods.

This course contributes to a graduate-level distance delivery curriculum in animal breeding and genetics, which is being developed with funding from the USDA-NIFA Higher Education Challenge Grants Program. Over the next three years, a consortium of seven universities (Virginia Tech, Colorado State, Iowa State, North Carolina State, and Kansas State Universities, and Universities of Nebraska-Lincoln and Georgia) will be engaged in the design and delivery of a series of asynchronous online courses, and several summer short-courses, focused on the integration of quantitative and molecular aspects of genetics.
