## **General Meeting Information**

The American Dairy Science Association® (ADSA®), the American Society of Animal Science (ASAS), and the Canadian Society of Animal Science (CSAS) will hold our 2009 Joint Annual Meeting in Montréal, Québec, Canada, July 12–16. #### Location

The Palais des congrés de Montréal (Montréal Convention Center) is ideally located at the center of the international district, or Quartier International de Montréal, within walking distance of the downtown business core, Chinatown, and Old Montréal, where the atmosphere is always festive with an abundance of shops, museums, and restaurants. The extensive Montréal underground walkway system links the Palais des congrés de Montréal to more than 4,000 premium hotel rooms, including the Hyatt (ADSA headquarters), the Delta Center-Ville (ASAS headquarters), and the Hotel InterContinental (CSAS headquarters). #### **Poster Presentations**

We have dedicated a two-hour block each morning to poster presentations. The "open poster" sessions will be from 7:30 to 9:30 am Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday in the Convention Center, Room 220CDE.

Each poster presentation will be available for public viewing for the entire day, with the presenting authors present during the "open posters" time (7:30 – 9:30 am). All posters must be mounted on the board 30 minutes before the beginning of the day's session (poster sessions begin at 7:30 am so posters must be mounted on boards by 7:00 am). The exhibit hall will open at 6:30 am, Monday through Wednesday. Posters must be removed after 5:00 pm each day. Any posters remaining after 5:30 pm will be removed by the convention center staff and discarded.

Each poster board area is 48 inches high and 96 inches wide. Use of this space is dictated by the presenter, with the following exceptions: the top of the poster space should include the abstract number, title, authors, and affiliations. The lettering for this section should be at least 1 inch high.

#### **Workshop Topics**

The following workshops will be offered at the 2009 ADSA-CSAS-ASAS Joint Annual Meeting:

- **Mixed Models Workshop** (separate registration fee required)
- Writing a Scientific Paper for Publication: Writing is an essential component of the scientific process and of every scientific career. It is the most valuable form of communication within the scientific community, and the scientific literature provides a permanent record (i.e., history) of research that present and future generations of scientists and policy-makers can use as a foundation for expanding knowledge and solving problems. Writing is the basic cost of admission to the scientific literature; however, graduate students and early-career scientists often view writing as an obstacle that separates them from their degrees, scientific publications, and career goals. This workshop is designed to help students understand how to turn a perceived obstacle into an opportunity to contribute to the scientific literature. The workshop will focus on the essential techniques for writing a manuscript for a peer-reviewed scientific journal and for shepherding a manuscript through the review/revision process. The basic structure for a manuscript and the pathway to publication will be based on the Journal of Animal Science (JAS) and Journal of Dairy Science® (JDS) models. The format will include lecture-type presentations, writing, editing, and proofreading exercises, and interactive discussions. Students will be expected to actively participate in the workshop. At the end of the workshop, students should understand the fundamental elements of writing a manuscript and seeing it through to publication in JAS or JDS within the next 12 months. The workshop fee is \$50.00, but if a paper from the workshop is submitted to JAS or JDS within 12 months of the workshop, there will be a \$100 discount on page charges. Space is limited to 12 students (first come, first served).
- JAS-JDS New Reviewer Workshop: The peer-review process is one of the cornerstones to the progress and dissemination of quality science. The Journal of Animal Science and Journal of Dairy Science rely on scientists around the world to provide complete, insightful, and timely reviews of submitted manuscripts. Maintaining a robust pool of reviewers for future manuscripts requires that new PhDs join the ranks of potential reviewers. Although participating in journal clubs and reviewing published articles are a part of many graduate programs, the more formal approach of reviewing submitted manuscripts is typically not. The objective of this workshop is to provide guidance to "near-term" PhD students in reviewing manuscripts. No charge but space is limited.


