ADSA Production Division Graduate Members, ADSA Dairy Foods Graduate Division Members, ADSA Southern Branch Graduate Members, NE ASAS/ADSA Graduate Members, ASAS Western Section Graduate Members and CSAS Graduate Members will present their papers in competition sessions early in the course of the 3 ¹/₂-day meeting. ADSA Production Division Members and CSAS Graduate Students will also be allowed to present their papers within their subject area. National ADSA Production Graduate Members are also eligible for sectional competition.

Competitors must be members in good standing in their respective national organizations and, if applicable, the sponsoring section/branch. The ADSA Foods, ADSA Production, ADSA NE Branch-ASAS NE Section and ADSA Southern Branch competitions are for oral presentations only; posters will not be accepted for these four competitions. The ADSA MS and PhD Production Poster competitions are for posters only and will not accept oral presentations.

ADSA National Production Division Graduate Competition Members must also select their subject area as the 2nd Preference and contact Headquarters if they would like to present that abstract within that section as a poster <u>only</u>. You MUST email your intent to present the abstract as a poster no later than **February 16, 2010**. Please include your tracking number, title, subject area and corresponding author in an email to <u>abstract@assochq.org</u>.

NATIONAL ADSA COMPETITION

GENERAL INFORMATION

Contests for the ADSA Graduate Student Paper Presentation Contest will be held in both Dairy Foods and Production Divisions of ADSA. Dairy Production Division will have both oral and poster contests with an MS and PhD division in each. Students can only compete in one contest each year. A certificate and cash award will be presented to first, second, and third place winners in each division. All participants must be members of ADSA. A photograph and a brief résumé including name, address, telephone number, degrees and date received, professional work experience, areas of research, scholarships and fellowships received, professional activities and memberships, and other special interests should be sent along with the abstract to the Division Contest Chairperson (see subsequent information). The résumés will be used to write the citations of the winners. Papers will be presented as a separate session within the **Production Division**. The paper is to represent original research by the contestant. In development of the plan of research and in preparing for the oral presentation, the contestant should have such counsel from the major professor as is expected normally. Some requirements for submission of abstracts differ between the two divisions. Consult the information on the appropriate Division.

PRODUCTION DIVISION ORAL CONTESTS (MS and PhD separate)

An institution is entitled to enter one participant per department in each of the MS and PhD **Production Division** contests. Students who have placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd previously may not enter this contest type again unless they change degree programs (ie. MS winners can compete at PhD level). They can, however, compete in the poster competition at that same degree level. Contestants must submit an Oral entry for the competition. If they wish, this can also be presented in the regular subject matter session as a poster presentation. It is not required that the graduate student present in both the Graduate Contest and the regular section. PRODUCTION DIVISION POSTER CONTESTS (MS and PhD separate)

The contests for the ADSA Graduate Student Poster Presentation (MS and PhD) will be held in the Production Division of ADSA. A certificate and cash award will be presented to first, second, and third place winners. All participants must be members of ADSA. An institution is entitled to enter two participants per department in each of the MS and PhD contests. Students who have placed 1st, 2^{nd} , or 3^{rd} previously may not enter this contest type again unless they change degree programs (ie. MS winners can compete at PhD level). They can, however, compete in the oral competition at that same degree level. Contestants must submit a Poster entry for the competition. If they wish, this can also be presented in the regular subject matter session as an Oral or Poster presentation. It is not required that the graduate student present in both the Graduate Contest and the regular section. To enter the contest, follow the instructions for submitting an abstract using the web abstract submission form and also submit a letter indicating your desire to enter the contest signed by your major professor and department head. Contestants not selected as finalists will present their papers as part of the regular research paper sessions. <u>The selected finalist will also be required to submit 4 copies of an extended abstract to Dr. Kailasapathy by April 30.</u> The extended abstract will consist (typed single-spaced) of a one-page Introduction, one-page Materials and Methods, and a two-page Results, Discussion, and Conclusions (no more than four pages total). The ADSA Northeastern Branch-ASAS Northeastern Section Annual Meeting will be held in conjunction with the national joint meeting of ADSA-ASAS. Graduate students must be members in good standing in their respective national society and a member of the Northeast section/branch. Graduate students will not be able to participate in both the national and the Northeast competition unless they submit 2 different abstracts--one for the Northeast and one for the National ADSA competition.
