General Meeting Information

The American Dairy Science Association® (ADSA®) and the American Society of Animal Science (ASAS) will hold the 2011 Joint Annual Meeting (JAM) in New Orleans, Louisiana, July 10–14. This brochure provides meeting highlights, registration, and housing information. Location

The meeting will be held at the New Orleans Ernest N. Morial Convention Center and area hotels. The convention center is ideally located near the famed French Quarter and the well-known Garden District. **For the first time, JAM will run a shuttle bus system from the headquarter hotels to the convention center.**

Attention Nonmember Attendees: Due to an increase in nonmember no-shows for posters and oral sessions, the following policy has been implemented for the 2011 Joint Annual Meeting. If an abstract is accepted, a presenter must attend the meeting to present (oral and poster presentations). If a non-member presenter is not registered for the 2011 Joint Annual Meeting by April 1, 2011, the abstract will not be published, it will be removed from the program, and it will no longer be available for presentation at the meeting.

Poster Presentations

We have dedicated a two-hour block each morning to poster presentations. The “open poster” sessions will be from 7:30 to 9:30 am Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday in the Convention Center, Hall 12J.

Each poster presentation will be available for public viewing for the entire day, with the presenting authors present during the open posters time (7:30–9:30 am). All posters must be mounted on the board 30 minutes before the beginning of the day’s session (**poster sessions begin at 7:30 am so posters must be mounted on boards by 7:00 am**) and must list the paper number and corresponding day. The exhibit hall will open at 6:30 am, Monday through Wednesday. **Posters must be removed after 5:00 pm each day.** Any posters remaining after 5:30 pm will be removed by the convention center staff and discarded.

Each poster board area is 48 inches high and 96 inches wide. Use of this space is dictated by the presenter, with the following exceptions: the top of the poster space must include the abstract number with corresponding letter of the day it is being presented, title, authors, and affiliations. The lettering for this section should be at least 1 inch high.

Each poster board number corresponds to the abstract number as noted in the program. For Monday posters an “M”; Tuesday posters a “T”; and for Wednesday posters a “W” precedes the board number.

Notice to Attendees

Use of cameras, video cameras, and cell phones (for calls or as cameras) is prohibited during oral and poster presentations to minimize disruption and unauthorized dissemination of data. Anyone found in violation of this policy will be asked to leave the session.

Transportation in New Orleans

The JAM hotels and the convention center are approximately 30 minutes by taxi cab from Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport (MSY). The one-way taxi fare from the airport will be \$33.00 (as of the time of printing). A shuttle service (Airport Shuttle) is also available; go online to book a shuttle in advance (<http://www.airportshuttleneworleans.com/>). The standard rate is \$38.00 round-trip or \$20.00 one way, with a \$5.00 discount for purchasing a ticket online.

This year, we will offer a shuttle service between all official JAM hotels and the Ernest N. Morial Convention Center. Please watch for the JAM shuttle area and signage with shuttle schedules in the lobby of your hotel.

The Convention Center is in the area known as the Warehouse District—a great central location for everything in the downtown area. Many people choose to walk the area, but three streetcar lines can help you get around if you prefer. Each trip on the streetcar costs \$1.25. Pre-conference on Biomedical and Agricultural Interventions or Therapies to Improve Human Health, Companion Animal Health and Farm Animal Health and Production

The American Society for Nutrition (ASN), ASAS, and ADSA are collaborating on a one-day pre-conference event: Agri-Medical Research: Providing Dual Benefit for Agriculture and Human Health on **Saturday, July 9**, in New Orleans.

This ASN-ASAS-ADSA pre-conference to the 2011 ADSA-ASAS Joint Annual Meeting will cover biomedical and agricultural interventions or therapies to improve human health, companion animal health, and farm animal health and production. Themes include metabolism, developmental origin of adult disease and infectious (zoonotic) diseases, and nutritional impact of pro-inflammatory response. Each symposium will span the spectrum from mechanistic to applied and include implications for a variety of animal species. Keynotes from outside, related disciplines will bring a unique view to the context of the presented science.

A poster competition for graduate students and post-docs will complement the presented science. A cocktail reception will directly follow the day's scientific sessions. The Triennial Lactation Symposium/Biology of Lactation of Farm Animals: Lactation Biology Training for the Next Generation—A tribute to Dr. H. Allen Tucker.

Dr. Tucker ("Tuck") had a tremendous impact on the field of mammary physiology, and his students are among the leaders in the field. The symposium showcases the breadth of the group of students of Dr. Tucker's PhD students, as an example of the lasting impact of his training on the future of the field. The program is a mix of invited presentations and abstracts selected from those submitted to the annual meeting. The intent is to offer to each speaker publication of a manuscript on the topic covered.

Workshop Topics

ASAS Poster and Oral Presentation Workshop: Presenting scientific data is an essential component of the scientific

communication process. It is one of the most valuable forms of communication within the scientific community. This workshop is designed to enhance the ability of students and scientists to present to their peers. The workshop will focus on the essential techniques for preparing and presenting poster and oral presentations. The basic structure of the presentations will be based on methods of presentations at ASAS-sponsored meetings. Students will be expected to actively participate in the workshop and submit an abstract for evaluation before the workshop. The workshop fee is \$50.00, but if the abstract used is submitted to an ASAS-sponsored meeting within 12 months of the workshop, the \$50.00 fee will be refunded. Space is limited to 12 students (first come, first served, with the exception that ASAS members will be given top priority).

Write Winning Grants, conducted by Grant Writer's Seminars and Workshops, LLC, sponsored by ASAS:

This widely acclaimed seminar comprehensively addresses both practical and conceptual aspects that are important to the proposal-writing process. It is designed for faculty members and administrative staff who have had some exposure to writing grant applications, either through training/mentoring or personal experience. This one-day symposium/workshop will be open to all attendees at the meeting. Individuals must attend this symposium/workshop to be considered for a position at the companion program Proposal-Writing Workshop: Write and Submit a Competitive Grant Application that ASAS will offer later in 2011. An additional \$50.00 charge is associated with this one-day symposium/workshop. The charge covers the cost of The Grant Application Writer's Workbook, which will walk you through step-by-step preparation of scientific grants. Workbooks are agency-specific and we expect this workshop/symposium to center around USDA and NIH submissions. The Mixed Models workshop provides a comprehensive exposition of proper statistical data analysis and power determinations of commonly used experimental designs in the animal sciences; our approach is example-driven and primarily based on the various mixed model analysis procedures available in SAS software. 
